- 7.1 Billion People on the Planet,.....

there are 7.4 Billion active Mobile Phones.

- On Facebook 1.3 billion profiles worldwide and 300 million photos are uploaded each day
- On Twitter 650 million users worldwide and 1 billion tweets every 36 hours
- On YouTube 60 hours of video posted every minute and 4 billion videos are watched everyday
- On WhatsApp 500 million users worldwide with 34 billion messages sent everyday

Issues for our Young people online....

- Cyberbullying.....

Sexting has been defined as the “exchange of sexual messages or images” or the “creating, sharing and forwarding sexually suggestive, nude or nearly nude images”

Remember...

- Once these images or messages have been sent they can end up anywhere
- They could be seen by friends and family, a future employer, or even in some cases, end up in the possession an offender
- If you wouldn't print and pass these images around your school or show your mum or dad, they are not appropriate to share via phone or computer

Safety on the Net...

DON'T... Give your address or any personal details about you, your friends or family

DON'T ... Agree to meet anyone you don't know

DON'T ... Go to anyone's house you don't know

DON'T ... Give or take money or possessions

DON'T ... Participate in forwarding pictures, messages or insults. You may think it's a joke but could be really upsetting
